November's block shows you how you can make a lot of half-square triangles quickly. This block can take on an infinite number of designs by using 3 or more colors in the half square triangle.

## Half Square Triangles:

1. Starting with the \#1 fabric, draw a vertical line down the center of the square (at $53 / 4$ "). Draw a second line horizontally across the center of the square (at $53 / 4$ ").

2. Place on fabric \#2 with right sides together. Since you are working with large squares of fabric, you may wish to pin the fabrics together to stabilize them. Sew a scant $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam on all four edges. Then sew a scant $1 / 4$ " seam on either side of the drawn center lines (shown in white for clarity).

3. Cut on the drawn lines in both directions so you have 4 blocks. Then for each block, cut on the diagonal in both directions.

4. Press each half square triangle open. The outside edges of this HST are cut on the bias and will stretch so be very careful not to stretch the edges when pressing. Trim each HST to $31 / 2$ " square. You will have 16 HSTs total.

5. Using these HSTs, assemble block as shown below. Press each row in alternating directions for easier assembly.

6. Trim to $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " square.
