"Oh Scrap" Clinton, IL - March 24-25

The Salt Creek Patchmakers Quilt Guild will be celebrating 30 years as a guild during our annual quilt show. It will be held Friday and Saturday, March 24 - 25, 2023 at Little Galilee Christian Camp in Clinton. Show will be open from 9 am to 6 pm on Friday and 9 am to 4 pm on Saturday.

"Oh, Scrap!" is this year's theme. We will be celebrating the scrappy quilt. Scrap quilts are by definition quilts that seem to be sewn with a random assortment of fabric – like the quilter placed their hand in a bin of fabric and pulled out pieces without looking. Historically, many scrap quilts were "make do" projects and were pieced with leftover fabric and even clothing items. We will feature quilts designed, pieced and quilted by area residents and members of the guild. Categories include bed quilts, wall hangings, miniatures, holiday, crib and lap throws, clothing and potpourri.

Non-voting exhibits include the Guild Challenge, the Winner's Showcase and the guild's charity projects.

A special bed-turning event will be featured at 10:30 a.m., 1 p.m., and 3 p.m. daily. This year's bed-turning will feature one of our members Arlene Bird. She will be sharing the history of her collection in front of the stage in the activity center.

Along with the annual show, vendors will be featured in a Quilting Expo and will have supplies, fabrics and notions available for sale. In addition, quilters who have spent time cleaning out their sewing rooms will have pre-owned quilting supplies, books and more for sale in the activity center.

Ornament of the Month

You're all familiar with Block of the Month – how about a new project – Ornament of the Month? In an effort to decorate a Christmas tree next year at the Antioch Kringle's Christmas Village (510 Orchard Street – near the Piggly Wiggly), we will be publishing a pattern for an ornament in the Newsletter every month through October. This month's offering is a Scandinavian or Danish Star. It is a no sew ornament. It takes less than ¼ yard of fabric and about an hour of your time.
