2023 Challenge Quilt Contest

For those participating in the 2023 Challenge Quilt Contest it is: **TIME FOR THE REVEAL!**

- Cover your quilt label (use a square of fabric and pin it over the label.)

- Write your Artist's Statement on a 4 x 6 card to include the name of the quilt and any design notes (inspiration source, special techniques, whatever). Pin the card to the front of your quilt. **Do not put your name on the card**! We want to keep everyone guessing!

- Bring your quilt to the September guild meeting in a container or bag so that it cannot be seen until display.

The voting is simple. All members who attend the September meeting get a ballot and choose their 1st, 2nd and 3rd favorites. 1st place votes are worth 3 points, 2nd place votes 2 points, 3rd place votes 1 point. The highest number of points wins.

October 28 - Fidget Quilts

In this workshop we will be making a fidget quilt using either a planned or serendipitous design. We will be making a quilt foundation which will then be embellished with a variety of ribbons, buttons, trims, yo-yos, etc.

November 25 – Ruler Quilting Demo Are you curious about Ruler Work? Sharon Wick will give us a hands-on demo and explain the sewing machine set up and supplies needed for this technique. If you are tired of quilting by check book and want to finish your own quilts, this demo is for you!

December 29 – Crocheting Around Fleece Think outside (but right up against) the box! Take a break from your sewing machine during our December Staytreat and pick up your crochet hook! Don't know how to crochet? Crocheting around fleece is a great way to learn! Experienced crocheter? Learn how to prep fleece for a beautiful crocheted border. **Note: Cost for this class will be a 1 ½" yard piece of anti-pill or blizzard fleece to be donated to Project Linus so keep an eye on those pre-holiday fleece sales!
