May 1 - Rafflemania

One of the most popular events of the year...
Rafflemania! Members donate gently used fiber related items to "raffle" off as a guild fundraiser. This includes items such as quilt books, yarn,

sewing supplies, sewing patterns, gadgets, rulers, templates, threads, bobbin holders, needles,

crochet and knitting supplies,

pins and of course, those fabrics that you once loved and now categorize as hideous. (Only fiber related items and no magazines.) Please bundle items together either in bags or with rubber bands to keep them from intermingling with other stacks.

How this works:

Items are placed on the tables next to paper bags. Members purchase and fill out raffle tickets to try for items they wish to win. (Hint: Return address labels come in handy for this!)

A name is drawn from each bag and the winner gets to take home the goodies!

Raffle tickets are \$1 each, 6 for \$5, 15 for \$10 and 35 for \$20.

If an item did not have any tickets submitted, the contributor is responsible for taking it home.

June 5 - Vicki Hodge

Vicki has been designing and piecing reproduction scrap quilts for over 40 years. An accumulation of unquilted tops naturally lead to pairing two tops into one quilt - equally interesting on front and back.



Vicki teamed with Quiltmania Editions to publish 'Button Box Quilts' in September, 2018. The book includes 20 designs (10 quilts) inspired by 19th century patterns.

Vicki has exhibited quilts at the Pour l'Amour du Fil show in Nantes, France; the Paducah Quilt Week Show in Paducah, Kentucky; and 'In the American Tradition' exhibit at the International Quilt Festival in Houston, Texas. Her AQSG Civil War Quilt Study quilt was selected to travel to several locations over four years.

The guild program trunk show includes quilts included in the book and those that didn't make the cut. Discussion of her quilting process is included along the way

The June meeting will also feature the Illinois Quilters Inc., annual raffle quilt. They will be selling tickets for a chance to win this beautiful quilt. This quilt will go on to be displayed as part of the Fine Art Fiber Show held at the Chicago Botanical Garden in November.

To make these blocks easier to sew into charity quilts we're asking everyone to give their bingo boards a 2" border (using 2 ½" strips). Black or white fabric would work best so as not to blend with the bingo squares.

Round Robin Quilt

Hello quilters! A new activity is starting in June... a Round Robin!

For those not familiar with a round robin, each participant makes a center block of their



choice. Their block gets passed on and the next person adds a "round", or border, to the top they are given. The blocks are passed each month until everyone in the round robin has added a border. How this will work:

Sign up at the May guild meeting or with Cathy at cathyb1810@gmail.com by May 28.

Put your block in a non-see-through bag that is large enough to accommodate a growing pieced top.

Each month the bags will be passed to the next person listed on a tag that you will be given to attach to your bag the first night.

We will keep them a secret until the last person has finished their border and then have a reveal at the next meeting.


Optional: Add a note to introduce yourself and journal the quilt. If you want, you can include any fabric you would like to be used along the way.

Book Review by Nann Hilyard

THREADS OF LIFE

Clare Hunter

(Warning: textile/fiber metaphors are inevitable!) I love textile history so it was a given that I would be totally enthralled (ensnared) by Clare Hunter's wonderful account. She weaves all the strands of eras into a shimmering panorama -- pre-Egyptian, the Bayeux Tapestry, Mary Stuart (she's written an entire book on the Queen of Scots' embroidery), and plain and fancy needlework in the ensuing centuries.

Hunter understands the psychological value of embroidery. She writes, "We think of embroidery as a confined art... hands, eyes, and a lap are all that are required. But that constricted environment can be expansive, a creative portal to other worlds, a way of staying connected, sewing not only as mental and physical comfort, but also a channel for knowledge, imagination, and passion." (48)

The chapter titles describe every aspect:
Unknown (the anonymous Bayeux stitchers),
Power, Frailty, Captivity, Identity, Connection,
Protect, Journey, Protest, Loss, Community, Place,
Value, Art, Work, Voice. I marked so many
passages of interesting stories that illustrate all of
Hunter's points!

"Sewing is a visual language. It has a voice. It has been used by people to communicate something of themselves--their history, beliefs, prayers, and protests. For some, it is the only means to tell of what matters to them: those who are imprisoned or censored, those who do not know how or are not allowed to write of their lives...Sewing is a graphic way to add information and meanings. But it is not a monologue.... it connects the maker to the viewer across time, cultures, generations, and geographies.... to provide a continuum of traditions, values, and perceptions." (176)

Wisconsin Museum Of Quilts & Fiber Arts 25 Million Stitches: One Stitch, One Refugee

(March 1–July 28, 2024)
25 Million Stitches: One Stitch,
One Refugee is an artistic
statement from the
international community about
human displacement,
immigration, and solidarity. It is



an aggregation of 25 million hand-sewn stitches, each representing a single displaced human being as counted in the UN's High Commissioner on Refugees 2019 report. The stitches are bound to 407 muslin banners, each 14' long. Building this physical representation of this statistic required participation from 2,300 stitchers from 37 countries, all 50 U.S. states.

Check out the ruler list. We have 77 rulers from the large 20" Dresdens to tiny templates for tiny quilts. We have several Flying geese rulers in different sizes. Need to cut scallops? There is a ruler for that. Take a peek at the Updated Missouri Star Block books and grab a new ruler to make something beautiful.

Need help cutting binding? We have Accquilt dies to cut 1.5, 2.5 and 3.5 dies to cut accurate strips. Doing a rag quilt? There is a die for that. Cut up to (6) 8.5" squares at a time, rag cuts included. Don't have a cutter? We do have 1 hand die cutter to lend out.


