### June 5 - Vicki Hodge

Vicki has been designing and piecing reproduction scrap quilts for over 40 years. An accumulation of unquilted tops naturally lead to pairing two tops into one quilt - equally interesting on front and back.



Vicki teamed with Quiltmania Editions to publish 'Button Box Quilts' in September, 2018. The book includes 20 designs (10 quilts) inspired by 19th century patterns.

Vicki has exhibited quilts at the Pour l'Amour du Fil show in Nantes, France; the Paducah Quilt Week Show in Paducah, Kentucky; and 'In the American Tradition' exhibit at the International Quilt Festival in Houston, Texas. Her AQSG Civil War Quilt Study quilt was selected to travel to several locations over four years.

The guild program trunk show includes quilts included in the book and those that didn't make the cut. Discussion of her quilting process is included along the way

**The June meeting will also feature the Illinois Quilters Inc., annual raffle quilt.** They will be selling tickets for a chance to win this beautiful quilt. This quilt will go on to be displayed as part of the Fine Art Fiber Show held at the Chicago Botanical Garden in November.

### August 7 – Nancy Brieschke

Nancy Brieschke, an accomplished quilter, has been quilting for over 50 years. Starting out as a traditional quilter she has now included modern and art quilts in her collection. She belonged to Salt Creek Quilters Guild, Hinsdale, IL. since 1983 until moving to Lake County in 2021. She served on the board in many capacities including president 2006-2008. In 1999 Nancy founded what is now known as Fair City Quilters in Sandwich, IL.

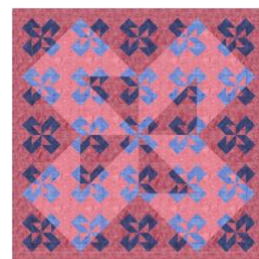
Many of her quilts have won various awards from quilt guilds and a local fair. Best of Show, Best of Show Original Designs, Best of Show Machine quilting, Viewer's Choice Award, First Place Advanced Category, Original Work Honorable Mention (National Quilting Association Juried Wall hangings), and a juried wall quilt that traveled for a year with the International Quilting Festival Celebrate Spring. Nancy has a quilt pattern registered with the Library of Congress.

Along with teaching several quilting workshops, Nancy has held many trunk shows for various groups.

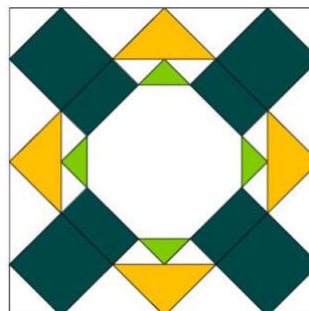

### Wisconsin Museum Of Quilts & Fiber Arts 25 Million Stitches: One Stitch, One Refugee



(March 1–July 28, 2024)  
*25 Million Stitches: One Stitch, One Refugee* is an artistic statement from the international community about human displacement, immigration, and solidarity.

It is an aggregation of 25 million hand-sewn stitches, each representing a single displaced human being as counted in the UN's High Commissioner on Refugees 2019 report. The stitches are bound to 407 muslin banners, each 14' long. Building this physical representation of this statistic required participation from 2,300 stitchers from 37 countries, all 50 U.S. states.

## Book Review by Nann Hilyard

### ALL THAT SHE CARRIED TIYA MILES

In the 1850's Ashley, a 9-year-old enslaved girl, was sold. Her mother Rosa gave her a cloth sack that contained "a tattered dress, three handfuls of pecans, and a lock of Rosa's hair." We know that because in 1921 Ashley's granddaughter Ruth Middleton embroidered the story on the sack. The sack was discovered at a flea market some 20 years ago and was given to Middleton Plantation, a historic site in South Carolina. Scholar Tiya Miles uses each element -- the sack, the contents, and the women who possessed it -- for a full recounting of the economic, social, and political milieu of slavery and plantation culture.

"The story of the bag and of their family ripples out like salted waves off the coast of Lowcountry, South Carolina, flowing into the histories of African America and the United States of America....this story cloth captures the emotional texture of Black women's lives during and after slavery, and reveals the staying power of love across time..." (p. 292)

I came for the textiles and stayed for the explication. (Truly, a story based on fabric spins out into history.) "All That She Carried" is an outstanding example of material culture scholarship.

Need help cutting binding? We have Accquilt dies to cut 1.5, 2.5 and 3.5 dies to cut accurate strips. Doing a rag quilt? There is a die for that. Cut up to (6) 8.5" squares at a time, rag cuts included. Don't have a cutter? We do have 1 hand die cutter to lend out.

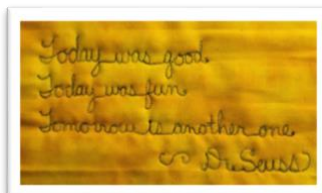

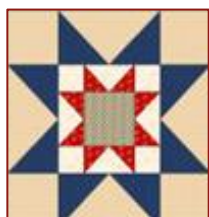
