Machine Maintenance Class

Hello fellow quilters! I am so pleased to bring to you sewing machine, maintenance 101! I believe I could speak for everyone when I say that you have invested a lot of time and money into our wonderful craft, that is certainly the case when it comes to our sewing machines. One of the things I've realized is when purchasing a machine, you're not properly taught how to maintain and care for your machine on an in-depth level. Well, those days are over! Please join me on May 10 from 9 AM to 12 PM when I will show you how to properly service your machine at home and avoid those pesky maintenance fees! After you take my class, you will only have to bring your machine in for major tune ups!

Here is a list of items that you will need to bring and or purchase for the class to effectively work on your machines:

1. Your machine

2. The tool set that you were provided when you purchased the machine or an equivalent

3. One can of condensed air or forced air

4. Q-tips, tweezers, sewer aid or sewing machine oil, wet wipes or something equivalent, small Phillips or flathead screwdriver if you don't have your original tool set for your machine.

Please note that I will be teaching you on your domestic machines, and I am certified in all brands with the exception of Brenna or Burnett.

There will be a five dollar donation collected the day of for charity. Also bring your lunch or snacks to munch while we are going through class.

She loves spending time with her family and with her "quilts" friends each week as she hosts her At Home with Misty tutorials. She is also hosting a new Missouri Star show called Homespun. Catch up with her as she chats with

designers, makers, and influencer in the world of fabric and fiber arts.

May 8 – Sweet Violet Class with Misty Doan

Is everyone ready for a little spring!? Please join Misty as she shows us how to make her Sweet Violet Quilt! Class will be held on May 8th, 2025 at the Grant Township center and start promptly at 9 AM and ending at 1 PM. Class is \$50 per person, which includes the pattern. One more thing, make sure you bring your pennies with you. Misty is going to have a small shop going during class for some extra goodies! This is going to be so much fun and I'm looking forward to it. Space is limited so it's first come first served. You will be able to pay for the class at our March meeting!

June 4 - Infinite Opportunity: Quilts Hidden in Your Stash by Carol Wilhoit

As quilters, we love to collect beautiful fabrics – yet we are often unsure how to put them all together to make quilts that we love. The term "scrap quilt" may bring to mind using leftovers that don't necessarily look good together. By contrast, while STASH quilts utilize your stash and scraps, they contain thoughtfully selected materials and look BETTER because of the variety – not tired because they were created just to use up fabrics. The lecture addresses several key design principles that make multi-fabric quilts work and includes pairs of quilts to show the impact of incorporating these considerations. Multiple examples of color combinations are provided to give ideas for selecting and using fabrics from your stash to make fabulous multi-fabric quilts.

During forty years of quilting, Carol has become interested in making both quilts and small quilted projects such as zipper bags, tote bags, table runners and pillows. Smaller projects do not require a large investment of time or materials, and therefore provide a perfect opportunity to exercise creativity. As a retired physician, she enjoys bringing her technical mind to quilting. She enjoys figuring out how to make the construction process easier while producing better results. She has also refined techniques for building, organizing, and using a fabric stash that make it a joy to have and to use. June 5 - How Far Can a Jelly Roll? - Carol will be presenting a 6 hour workshop June 5 at the Grant Township Community Center. The cost for the workshop is \$45, which includes the \$5 fee for the use of the community center. The workshop starts at 9:30 am.

Have you bought some packages of 2 ½" wide strips because the fabrics are so beautiful, and coordinate so well – but they remain unused because you don't know what to make with them? Or have you seen a package of richly colored batik strips or a fun thirties jelly roll, and wanted to get it, but you've been hesitant because you don't know how to use it? In this class, we will start with a package of 2½" strips and add coordinating fabrics to make a table runner, tote bag, notebook cover and zippered document bag. You will finish some in class and leave with instructions for finishing the others. You will be amazed at how far your jelly can roll!

July 2 – Bingo Game Night & Ice Cream Social Mystery Quilt Display

Enjoy yummy ice cream treats (watch those sticky fingers) while viewing our finished mystery quilts and playing Bingo! We're changing things up this year so you won't need to create your own bingo card.
